

# **9th SPAI STEERING GROUP MEETING**

- DRAFT AGENDA AND ORGANIZATIONAL ISSUES -

**Ohrid, November 4 – 5, 2005** 



## Background

The **Stability Pact Anticorruption Initiative** (SPAI) was adopted in Sarajevo in February 2000 to address one of the most serious threats to the recovery and development of South East European countries. Corruption is highly detrimental to the stability of democratic institutions and considerably undermines the business climate, discourages foreign direct investment and hampers economic growth.

The SPAI takes a **multidisciplinary approach to fighting corruption**, incorporating issues such as the adoption of international legal instruments, promotion of good governance, strengthening the rule of law, promotion of transparency and integrity in business operations and development of an active civil society.

Furthermore, periodically, the SPAI Steering Group meets in order to maintain a high level of information exchange among the countries of the region and also to provide all partners with a **general framework for coordination**, optimization of effort and permanent dialogue with the donor community.

In September 2003, SPAI Steering Group approved to transfer the Secretariat of the SPAI<sup>1</sup> to the region in order to promote local ownership of the Initiative and further enhance regional capacities to lead the fight against corruption in South East Europe. The SPAI RSLO as legal entity was established by the Agreement between Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Office of the Special Coordinator of the Stability Pact for South Eastern Europe – signed on 15 September 2003. Since March 2004, SPAI RSLO is fully operational and serves as an executive implementing body of the SPAI, initiating and organizing anticorruption activities at national and regional level in cooperation with the SPAI senior representatives and international partners.

In May 2005, Ministers of Justice from all SPAI member countries met in Brussels and reinforced their commitment to adopt impact oriented measures in order to curb corruption phenomenon in South Eastern Europe. As a concrete step in this regard countries of the region set a challenging calendar to implement **10 joint measures to curb corruption**. Furthermore, member countries committed themselves to provide full support and assistance to the SPAI Regional Secretariat in order achieve its goal and to become **Anticorruption Center for Excellence**.

During the 9<sup>th</sup> SPAI Steering Group Meeting the following topics will be further discussed and agreed upon:

- First measures adopted by the countries of the region in order to implement the Ministerial Declaration on 10 joint measures to curb corruption in SEE;
- Anticorruption initiatives/projects developed and implemented at regional level by the SPAI partners;
- Progress achieved by SPAI RSLO in implementing the Workplan for 2004 2005
- The Plan for activities to be implemented within the SPAI framework, 2006 2007.

### **Objectives**

The main objectives of the 9<sup>th</sup> Steering Group are:

- to assess the progress made both at national and regional level in the implementation of the SPAI objectives and of the 10 measures to curb corruption as endorsed in Brussels Ministerial Meeting;
- to assess the SPAI RSLO performance in implementing the Workplan for 2004-2005;
- to adopt the Plan for activities to be implemented within the SPAI framework, 2006 2007.

#### Organizers

The SPAI Steering Group is organized by the SPAI Regional Secretariat Liaison Office in cooperation with the Macedonian Ministry of Justice and State Commission for Prevention of Corruption.

#### **Participants**

The invitation is extended by the SPAI Chairman to the SPAI Steering Group members including the Senior Representatives of the eight member countries, donor countries, international organizations and international financial institutions.

#### Documents

To facilitate the discussion, the member countries, donor countries and the participating organizations are invited to submit until October 25<sup>th</sup> to the SPAI RSLO the progress reports developed according to the attached template. Copies of these documents will be distributed before to the meeting.

Also, prior to the meeting the SPAI RSLO will ensure the distribution of additional documents such as:

- the Plan for activities to be implemented within the SPAI framework, 2006 2007 (draft version);
- the latest SPAIgram.

The **working language** of the meeting is **English**. No translation will be provided.
